


#### Well, 2021 went fast!



#### The History of New Year's Day

Celebrating the first day of another year on Earth has been a historical tradition for millennia. After all, survival and new beginnings are a pretty big deal. However, New Year's Day, as most of the world currently celebrates it, on January 1st, is a fairly recent invention. In fact, there have been a lot of different days chosen to mark the start of a new year.

The first recorded new year celebration happened in Mesopotamia four millennia ago, about 2000 B.C. They picked the vernal equinox, around March 20, to mark the beginning of their new year. After that, we have records of other ancient civilizations, including the Egyptians, Persians, and Phoenicians, choosing the autumnal equinox, around September 20, to be the start of their new year. Then, the ancient Greeks picked the winter solstice, around December 20, to begin the new year.

Enter the Romans: Emperor Julius Caesar decided to end all of the confusion by creating a standardized calendar that would follow the solar year.

After consulting with scientific experts, in 46 B.C., he introduced the Julian calendar. In this calendar, January I was established as the official first day of the new year. This coincides with the time of year that the Earth is closest to the sun. It's also in honor of Janus, the namesake god of January, known for having two faces—one looking forward to the future and one looking backward to the past. That wasn't quite the end, however. In 1582, Pope Gregory XIII tweaked the Julian calendar, creating the Gregorian calendar, which is the standard most of the world uses today. He re-established January I as New Year's Day.

The creation of the Grand Lodge was approved by membership in January of 1871. Charter Number 1 was issued to New York and Charter Number 2 was issued to Philadelphia. The incorporation of Grand Lodge was enacted by the State of New York in March of the same year. Grand Lodge requirement was to be a PER, Past Exalted Ruler.



The Life Magazine edition of January 15, 1941 publishes the Elks presentation of The Uncle Sam Poster to President Franklin D. Roosevelt. The Elks National Defense and Public Relations Commission becomes the Elks War Commission on January 4th, 1942. Elks membership in 1871 was 243 and Elks membership in 1968 during the Elks Centennial was 1,452,187.

Most notable historical events are attributed to the Grand Lodge year in which they occur and there have been millions of events. The Millionth Elk was Raymond Cole of Bay City, Michigan, Lodge No. 89.

watch. Rewards go up from there. See you at the Lodge.


