

Eureka Lodge #652 Veterans Committee



Elks pledge "So long as there are veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them." The Veterans committee, utilizing funding available through the Elks National Foundation (ENF) Grant Programs combined with additional lodge funding was able to conduct the following activities to provide local assistance not only for our local veterans but also to others in the community hit hardest by the Covid-19 Pandemic.

A \$4500 donation in the form of Grocery Gift Cards to the "Veteran" residents of the Bayview Heights Independent Living facility in Eureka. Bayview Heights was built specifically to address the affordable housing

shortage in Humboldt County for individuals transitioning from homeless into the lowest income levels. The grant was funded by a \$2000 ENF Gratitude Grant and a lodge donation of \$2500.

A \$3500 donation funded by a ENF Beacon Grant to Food for People, the designated Food Bank of Humboldt County. Prior to the pandemic, Food for People was helping feed 12,000 Humboldt County residents a month. Presently 16,000 residents depend on assistance a month. Last year, Food for People distributed nearly 2.5 million pounds of food to residents of Humboldt County through their food delivery programs alone.

A \$1000 donation to the Mad River Veterans Honor Guard. The Honor Guard, a local group of veterans, provide military honors for other veterans who have passed away.

As we move forward into 2022 the committee continues to meet on a regular basis. We encourage you to join us. New members bring new ideas on how we can continue to fulfill the Elks "pledge" of service to our nation's veterans and military members, especially to those most in need. CHEA Convention Report

I attended the Annual CHEA (California/Hawaii Elks Association) Convention May 18th through 21st. I attended the Secretaries and Trustees training, and the District Deputy, Lodge Advisor and District Leader training among other things. Chartering makes a Lodge potentially responsible should they be a respondent in a lawsuit. Lawsuits are unlikely at this point. Eureka 652 does not have a Charter Troop, so we are okay. Lodges can donate to them via cash, facility use, etc. Lodges can support them in most ways, and let them participate in Lodge activities, but Lodges should not "Charter" a Boy Scout Troop.

I have retired as an officer in Elkdom; however, Joe DiLoreto had an issue and needed to resign from the Secretary position. I have been appointed the Interim Secretary by Exalted Ruler Marta Martinez. That doesn't mean I will stay here forever. Someone needs to step up and be trained for this position, and soon. I had made many plans for my retirement, which have now been placed on hold. It's costing me on all accounts. I bought a new pickup, upgraded my travel trailer, and prepared to have an extended vacation.
