This is OUR Lodge lets make it a great year with an abundance of success.



# PROPOSED BY-LAW CHANGES ARTICLE V: ELECTIVE OFFICERS AND DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY

By a Motion seconded and passed, 25 in favor and 4 against: Section 4. Paragraph 6 reads; For the faithful performance of his duties, he shall receive as compensation \$10,200.00 per annum, payable monthly. Change the amount to \$17,160.00.

### OF THE TREASURER

By a Motion seconded and passed, 25 in favor and 4 against: Section 5. Paragraph reads; He shall be required to give bond to the Lodge in the sum of \$10,000.00 for the faithful performance of his duties, and shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of \$5,100.00 per annum, payable monthly. Separate the two thoughts into two sentences and change the amount as follows. Change the comma to a period and reword the second sentence to read; For the faithful performance of his duties, he shall receive as compensation \$9,360.00 perannum, payable monthly.

### OF THE TRUSTEES

By a Motion seconded and passed, 24 in favor and 5 against: Section 6. Add paragraph 10 that reads; Except for the Exalted Ruler, who is an ex-officio member of the Board of Trustees by reason of his office, the term of office for each trustee shall be five years. Consecutive terms are not allowed, except when a member has been elected to serve out a vacated and unexpired term. The Trustee serving the partial term may be re-elected to serve out a full term without a break in service. A member who has served as a Trustee may be elected to again serve as a Trustee after he has been off the board for one-year or more.

### ARTICLE X: FEES AND DUES

### Section 1. Change the initiation fees from \$30 to \$100 and from \$30 to \$50 as follows:

By a Motion seconded: The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant who has passed twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$100.00, all of which should accompany the proposition. A motion to amend was seconded and passed changing the \$100.00 to \$50.00. Therefore, by a Motion seconded and passed unanimously: the fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant who has passed their twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$50.00, all of which should accompany the proposition.

By a Motion seconded and passed unanimously: The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant making application prior to his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$50.00, all of which should accompany the proposition.


By a Motion seconded and passed unanimously: Section 2 (b). Add paragraph 3 that reads as follows: The fee for replacing lost membership cards and or key cards shall be \$5.00.

By a Motion seconded and passed unanimously: Section 4. Change the reinstatement fee from \$30 to \$50 as follows: Before such reinstatement, the applicant shall pay to the Lodge a reinstatement fee of \$50.00, and an addition thereto, a proportionate share of the current dues, prorated in the same manner as the dues of a new member, together with any indebtedness owing to the Lodge or Club.

### **HOUSE RULES**

By a Motion seconded and passed unanimously: Add House Rule number 17 that reads; Any person who bartends or provides any service behind the bar is required to be RBS (Responsible Beverage Service) certified and comply with California State Laws.

The hierarchy of Elkdom will continue to be a part of my monthly articles. The District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler represents the Grand Exalted Ruler in our District. He is commonly referred to as the DD or District Deputy. Dennis Hunter, who is from our Lodge is the DD for 2022-2023. He was sworn in at the Grand Lodge Convention in July and will serve for one year. Occasionally



a DD serves two terms as I did several years ago. The DD is generally promoted from the Association Vice-president's (AVP) position. Dennis was "jeweled" on July 16 in the Lodge room.

The DD's job is different from the AVP. The DD is the go-to person when a Lodge has an issue they can't seem to solve. The DD inspects all the District Lodges for compliance with the Statutes, Rules and Regulations of the Order. He, if required, wears a black hat, whereas the AVP wears a white hat. Most importantly, the DD provides support and guidance to the Lodges and their Officer corps. He is available to all during his tenure. There are other positions in the District, State Association and Grand Lodge that will be noted in future articles.

Our Lodge is once again growing. We have about 50 candidates in line to become members. The process takes about two months because we read the application on the Lodge Floor at one meeting, vote during the next meeting, orientate the next month and finally initiate. COVID-19 really slowed the process by closing us down for months at a time. We have been slowly catching up. We are getting more and more new applications since the end of the COVID scare. I expect we will be over 1,400 members once again by the end of the year in spite of lapsations. Lapsations occur for several reasons. First, members lose interest for one reason or another. Second, a member moves away and either drops Elkdom or dimit transfers to another Lodge. Or lastly, a member passes away.

My office is always open to members who may have questions or concerns about most anything in Elkdom. I may not have a solution or an answer to an issue, but I'll certainly listen and work with you to find a solution or answer. Communications is key to understanding and resolving issues. One of my responsibilities and perhaps most important duty is Lodge membership. I account for all aspects of membership including candidates and member fees and dues. Some of you have paid your dues, but are still receiving billing statements. The billing is done through Grand Lodge. Sometimes there is a time lag between when you pay and when it's recorded at Grand Lodge. Please call us if there is any confusion.

Since 1982 working in partnership with multiple federal agencies including the Drug Enforcement Agency and national organizations such as Pride Youth Programs the Elks provides an effective,



community-based drug prevention program ensuring it addresses the leading drug abuse issues facing communities today.

The program's Drug Awareness Program Resource Center provides parents, teachers and kids access to educational materials including anti-drug literature, videos, coloring books, posters, public service announcements and prevention tools for parents along with information on the annual poster, essay and video contests.

The importance of educating our youth and parents on the impact of drugs and alcohol use is even more important today as it was in 1982.

To assist with this, each month starting in August the Lodge's Drug Awareness Committee will be posting through our online mailing access examples of the resources available. 



## **Description of Officer Positions:**

TILER: The Tiler shall be stationed at the outer door of the Lodge room at all meetings and permit no person to enter without previous announcement through the Inner Guard, and permission of the Exalted Ruler. He/She shall require all members to show their membership cards. Section 12.080 Position appointed by Exalted Ruler.

INNER GUARD: Guards the Inner door of the Lodge. Announce a member who is entering the Lodge meeting to the Exalted Ruler. Participates in Ritual. Section 12.100 Appointed by the Exalted Ruler.

ORGANIST/Pianist: Shall provide the music prescribed by the rituals of the Order and perform such other duties as assigned to you. Section 12.110 We currently do not have an Organist and if you are an organist and would like to join the Officer Core please come talk to the Exalted Ruler or another Officer. Position appointed by Exalted Ruler.

CHAPLIN: Section 12.100 Upon assuming office, you must review the parts of the Opening and Closing and Initiatory rituals applicable to your office and be sufficiently familiar with other rituals to permit impressive rendition of your parts. And although not required by the Laws of the Order, it is customary in most Lodges, where invocations and benedictions are part of the various social activities, that the Chaplain performs this function with suitable words of his or her choice. Position appointed by the Exalted Ruler.


