#### **The Veterans Corner**

## "So long as there are veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them"

The Annual Elks Veteran Car Show was held at the Lodge on September 24, 2022. There were 68 entries. Over 150 in attendance. Trophies were awarded in six different classes. In addition, an Opportunity Drawing was held. The car show raised \$3500 with \$1000 of the funds designated specifically to the be used to support the North Coast Veterans Stand Down.

The North Coast Veterans Stand Down was staffed by 9 members form the Lodge. The Lodge supported the 2022 North Coast Veterans Stand Down held at the Humboldt County Fairgrounds in Ferndale the last week in September by providing meals to the participants and service providers. We served 3 lunches and a dinner. Financial assistance was provided to the Adult and Teen Challenge of Humboldt County by purchasing ingredients for their BBQ lunch. The total meals served over the four days by the Elks was 1100. Rain Ponchos were also distributed to the designated "Homeless" attendees. The meals and ponchos were funded through a \$3000 Freedom Grant which was one of only 200 awarded this year by the Elks National Foundation. The event was staffed by twelve members of the lodge, three non-member volunteers and four Emblem club members for a total of nineteen support staff over a sixday period.

The November 11, 2022 Friday Night Cook Your Own Steak Night (CYOS) is also Veterans Day, a designated Federal holiday intended to honor all who served in the American armed forces, both those who are alive and those who died. This provides the Lodge the opportunity to recognize our veteran members for their service to our nation that evening. A Missing Man Table will be set in honor of fallen, missing, or imprisoned military service members. As always, all members of the Lodge and guest are encouraged to attend CYOS dinners. Veteran members are especially encouraged to attend that evening.

## From Your Lodge Secretary...

I didn't write an article for the October Herd talk because if was hunting season, and I have my priorities. Just joking. Frankly I ran out of time. Submissions to the Herd Talk need to be in before the Friday after the second meeting of the month. That gives time for the editor and publisher to finish up before the end of the month and mailing or emailing.

The October fest was a great hit this year. The food



was excellent and the raffle was one of the best. This and other events are for our members and their guests. The cost of the event is barely being covered at the prices we are charging. To that end, I want to take a quick survey of our members about what to charge for dinners.

Many don't fully understand what the cost of a dinner at the Lodge entails. The cost of the food has increased substantially this past year, yet we have held the price at \$15 for Wednesday and \$25 for Friday night. Food isn't the only cost involved. We are an all-volunteer Lodge, except for dishwashers, janitorial and some administration. Wages by necessity have also increased a small amount. All of this is easy to understand. What's more difficult is the allocation of other costs associated with all Lodge activities, such as, the share of the property taxes (\$29,000.00 per year), general maintenance, electricity and other utilities. These "other" costs need to be allocated to each meal.

Here's the bottom line so far this year. The profit and loss for the dining room is a negative -\$13,104.26. Yes, it's a loss. The bar has brought in \$34,515.71. That means that the "Club or social quarters is running at a \$21,411.45 net profit. That money can be used for anything the membership sees fit to use it for, but other costs will undoubtedly use it up rather quickly. What has been outstanding is the RV Park. They brought in \$33,914.78. In fact, the RV park kept us well during the COVID pandemic. That means the total in the black as of last month was \$55,326.23. That's great, but one cost that still needs to be paid is the property tax of about 29,000.00, which reduces the "in the black" down to \$26,326.23 minus other expenses yet unpaid.

You have probably stopped reading by now. Numbers are boring. The issue is what to do about the loss in the dining room. RAISE PRICES or LOWER FOOD COST. Every time we raise prices some of our membership rant and raves about the costs. Frankly, a meal the quality of our Friday night steak dinner costs \$15 to \$20 dollars more downtown. Where can you get a rib-eye steak, starch and vegetable of some kind, salad bar, desert, and access to a reasonable bar anywhere else for \$25.00. Two people eat here for



\$50 and eat elsewhere for \$100. Meal decisions will have to be made soon by our Lodge and I wanted to give you some of the background information so our membership will understand why we may need to increase our meal prices.

# **Drug Awareness Program**

**On October 29, 2022** the Drug Enforcement Agency held its **National Prescription Drug Take Back Day.** Take Back Day is a chance to rid medicine cabinets of unneeded medicines and collected: Tablets, Capsules, Patches and Other solid forms of prescription drugs. Although the Drug Take Back Day is over, you can still deposit expired, unused or unwanted medications utilizing **Local Medication Disposal Bins** which are available year-round.



Before depositing you need to: Remove medications from containers Place them in sealed or zipped plastic bags Drop them into the bin Do not drop off sharps (needles, syringes, Epi Pens).

These pharmacies have bins that can take unused or expired medications.

Arcata: Arcata Police Department and Barnes Family Drug Eureka: Eureka Police Department, Lima's Professional Pharmacy and the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Fortuna: Green's Pharmacy Ferndale: Ring's Pharmacy Scotia: Palco Pharmacy Willow Creek: Willow Creek Pharmacy Garberville: Humboldt County Sheriff's Office

Many of the larger chain pharmacy departments, CVS, Walgreens, Costco, Safeway,. have Disposal Bins or will tale take back unused prescription drugs across the counter.




