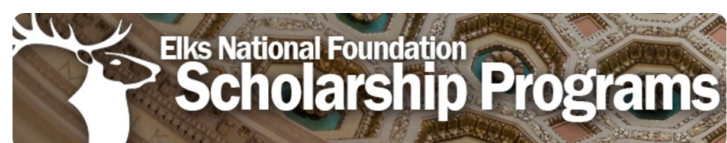
Elks National Foundation Scholarship Programs

The 2022 Most Valuable Student Scholarships are available starting August 1, 2022. You must be a High School Senior and a U.S. Citizen. Your application will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need. **You must access the application online at enf.elks.org/mvs. Deadline for completing the application online is November 14, 2022.**

The Elks National Foundation Scholarship Program provides 2.44 million dollars in scholarships annually. Three boys and three girls' applications will be selected from our lodge to compete at the District, State, and National levels. Five hundred four-year awards will be presented in the spring of 2023.

Legacy Awards Scholarships are for college-bound high school seniors who are the children or grandchildren of dues-paying Elks. Applicants compete against other children and grandchildren from the state of the sponsoring Elk Lodge. Applications are judged on the core values of the Elks National Foundation. **Applications must be accessed online at enf.elks.org/leg. Application must be submitted online by February 4, 2023, at 11:59 a.m. Central Time.**

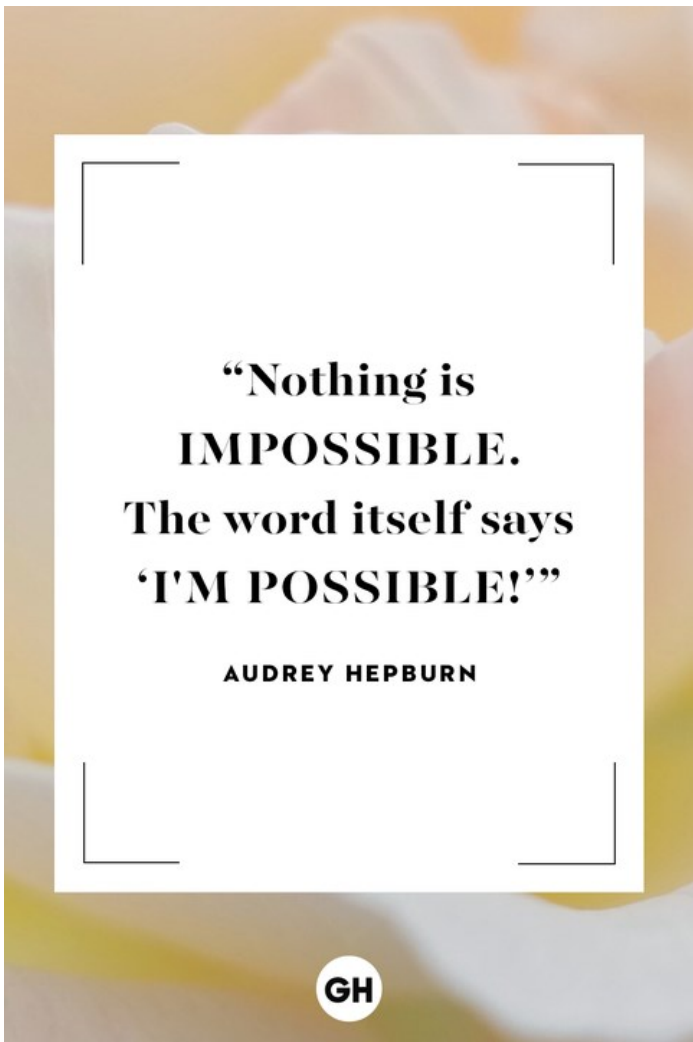

2022-2023 Elks “Hoop Shoot” Free Throw Contest

Each year more than three million boys and girls, ages 8-13, participate in the Elks “Hoop Shoot” Free Throw Contest, the largest and most visible of the many youth activities sponsored by Elks lodges. From the millions of youngsters who participate and advance through local, district, state and regional competition, six national champions are named. One boy and one girl in each of three categories: ages 8-9, 10-11 and 12-13. The parents of finalists at the state, regional and national levels attend the competitions as guests of the Elks.

During the past Covid-19 epidemic several of the lodge’s programs and activities were suspended or discontinued due to community restrictions. The Lodge’s annual participation in the Elks “Hoop Shoot” Free Throw Contest was one of the programs. This year the lodge has established the goal to reinstate the program and provide the youth of Humboldt County the opportunity to participate. To do so the lodge is need of members to serve on the Hoop Shoot Committee. The committee’s responsibilities include finding a site location, establishing a date, and publicity. Additional volunteers will be needed the day of the competition. This is an excellent opportunity for younger members to become involved in supporting a lodge activity.

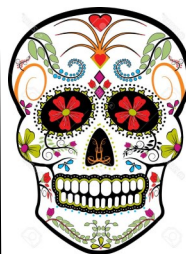
