BUDGET ISSUES:

I tossed in a lot of numbers in November's article, which brought in some questions from members. I thought I would update and clarify the numbers in this article. These are year to date (YTD) numbers from April through October 2022 (the first 7 months of the fiscal year).

The Bar has a 30% cost of goods (COG) with a 15% profit margin for a profit of \$20,940.66

The Dining Room has a 59% cost of goods with a 10% loss margin for a loss of \$15,716.37

The RV Park has a 51% profit margin for a profit of \$38,725.52, and a gain of \$11,789.90 in the restricted RV Improvement account. This brings their restricted RV Improvements account to \$47,139.99

The Lodge, which includes the Bar, Dining room, RV and the Lodge itself, had a 13% profit margin for a profit of \$64,840.49. This is due to the excellent management of the Bar and RV Park.

The problem, of course, is the dining room. The COG is absurdly high. Some may say it's okay because we are making a profit in the bar, which balances against the loss. However, 59% COG is unacceptable. A 40% COG is acceptable and preferred. The problem is exacerbated by the fact that the House Committee is required by Grand Lodge Statute to provide a segregated budget. It's okay to not make a profit, but a negative budget is unacceptable. The House Committee will undoubtedly review the Profit and Loss and make corrections where needed. Enough from me.

MEMBERSHIP AND LAPSATION:

Our Lodge is growing back to where we were pre-COVID. We have 1,398 members with a 7.28% lapsation. This is much better than many lodges, but we can do better. First, 97 of you have not paid your 2022 dues. You have until March 31 to pay or be dropped from the roles. Once dropped, you can't even enter any Elks lodge anywhere until you have been reinstated. Those that are delinquent and who do not plan on returning this year should pay up for this year and then request an absolute dimit. That makes it easy to come back at some point in the future. Second, bring in new members. The application fee is now \$50, but it is well worth the fee. There are many advantages in becoming an Elk, including RV parks, inexpensive meals and drinks at any lodge. Visiting the Honolulu or San Francisco Lodges just once is worth it. Apply online or come in and get an application. I'll mail you one if you request it.

HOLIDAY SEASON:

The entire administrative staff and I wish you and yours the best holiday season ever. We have a lot to be thankful for, like coming out of the COVID pandemic. It doesn't matter how its spoken: God Jul, Frohe Weihnachten, Feliz Navidad, it all means the same; Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.


