Each outing has a Trailblazer and a Greaser. These two have the responsibility of planning and making all of the arrangements for a successful adventure.

The Roamers had their annual Christmas Potluck at the Elks Lodge on Thursday, December 1. We had fifty Roamers in attendance. Each Roamer Family brought an unwrapped toy for Marines Toys for Tots Program. We had a short program before sampling the hors d'ouervre. Dave Eberhardt made a replicate of the Christmas Tree Ornament that was placed on White House Christmas Tree last year. Dave Eberhardt and Karen Ritter presented the ornament to ER Marta Martinez to be displayed in the Lodge. Dale Stockly presented Dan Wilson with a plaque that he will hang on his RV designating him as our Wagon Master. Dale also gave Cheryl Holt, our outgoing secretary, red and white tulips for her 10 years of note taking. It was a fun evening with lots of good fellowship. Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!

Another calendar year has passed, and what a year it was. We have finally left the COVID-Era, which was basically 2019-2022. Our membership did well during this era in spite of COVID. Few member deaths were attributed to COVID. Our Lodge is being used by the membership and their guests once again. Lodge activities are the key to a healthy and prosperous Lodge. I thank those that maintained their membership during the tough years. Our membership stands at 1,396 with less than 90 members who haven't paid this year's dues.

Speaking of dues, those that haven't paid their dues for the year 2022-2023 will be receiving a letter stating the consequences of not paying as required by Grand Lodge. Grand Lodge does the dues billing. Sometimes there is an information lag between Grand Lodge and our local Lodge. Sometimes a member is billed when they have already paid. That's an easy fix. Call me and I'll take care of it. The dues for 2023-2024 will be \$160 for regular members and \$70 for life members because Grand Lodge raised their add-on by \$5. It was necessary because of liability and other insurance costs. Our Lodge portion of the dues will remain the same at \$120. Add \$1 for a spousal card. Those who lose their key card after we issue it to them will pay \$5 for a replacement.

We are going to purchase an electronic information kiosk for the foyer of our Lodge. There are several reasons. First is the mess. The foyer gets messy when there are several events being advertised on separate easels. There are letter size and poster size notices all over the place. The purpose of the advertising gets lost in the clutter. Secondly is information. We would like to be able to not only display information but update it on a regular basis. Last is the cost. We print posters and announcements in color, which is costly over the long run. An electronic kiosk eliminates these issues.

What we are proposing is basically a 55-inch monitor standing on end off the floor with wheels. It's a thin very attractive display that can easily be programed and reprogramed. It is interactive. A member can come in and touch the screen on the calendar to see what's happening on that day or what's for dinner that night. The cost is a little over \$4,000. The Past Exalted Rulers Association is putting up \$500. The Bobillot Family Trust is putting up \$500. The Emblem Club will be putting something towards the cost, and I'll be asking the RV if they will participate in the cost. The Trustees will probably recommend money be taken out of the service fee account to be put towards the purchase. Those who want to donate please contact the Clerk or Secretary.

I need to clear up what seems to be a misunderstanding. We are out of budget as reported in the last Herd Talk, but it is not the fault of the House Committee or any other entity. It's COVID related. It was virtually impossible to budget for income and expense when we had so many unknowns due to COVID and its affect on our Lodge.







Americanism by Nina Strang, Esteemed Lecturing Knight. The U.S. Flag Code, 4U.S. Code Section 8(i), prohibits using the flag of the United States for any advertising purpose. The Code states that the flag should not be embroidered, printed or otherwise impressed on such articles as cushions, handkerchiefs, napkins, boxes, or anything intended to be discarded after temporary use. Both of these sections are generally ignored, almost always without comment. There are other sections that apply such as the flag should never tough the ground, be burned in a disdainful manner, be dipped in a salute to other flags, etc. Flags flying at night must be lit. The flag is dear to our hearts and close to our altar as Elks.
