Redwood Roamers of Eureka California Elks

The Redwood Roamers RV Club has 54 families who enjoy sharing the outdoors together. The Roamers meet the first Wednesday of the month at the Lodge to spread fellowship and plan monthly outings. Each outing has a Trailblazer and a Greaser. These two have the responsibility of planning and making all of the arrangements for a

February 1 saw our first meeting of the year with over 50 Roamers attending. Six outings are already in the planning stage and another 10 have been voted on by the body. It's going to be a fun and busy year. Brad Smith, lodge secretary, presented a proposal for the Lodge to acquire an electronic kiosk. After a brief discussion the Roamers voted to contribute \$500 towards this goal. Private donations of \$160 were also collected. Our "Go Nowhere Rally and Outing" is scheduled for the weekend of March 24th-26th, 2023, here at the Lodge. Roamer members, Julie and Martin Smith of Pasadena, have taken it upon themselves to sponsor and donate all supplies needed for the \$25 per prime rib dinner March 26th. 100% of proceeds will be donated by the Redwood Roamers to the Pine Hill School District. Please plan to attend. This is Elks Lodge "Lets all volunteer" month. The most aspect to a vibrant and successful Lodge is volunteering. Here are some of the things the Roamers are doing. This February saw 2 workdays ram rodded by Dave Eberhardt and Howard Ritter. We worked on the general grounds, repainted electrical boxes, and painted numbers on each RV site. Other work included a boarder installed to keep small dogs from escaping the dog run. The roamers also continue to volunteer their time and hard work as the "salad bar crew" for Friday night dinners. There are lots of ways you can also help the Lodge. Please volunteer. Dan Wilson, Wagon Master.

This will be my last article as the Secretary in the Herd Talk. I am retiring from the Secretary's position as of April 1, 2023. I have served Elkdom as a Lodge trustee for 5 years, a Leading Knight, Exalted Ruler, Chaplain and Esquire for 1 year each, District Business Practices for 5 years, District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler for 2 years, California-Hawaii Elks Association Drug Awareness Vice Chair and Chair for 4 years. That totals a whopping 20 years of service at all levels of Elkdom. I have enjoyed doing my service; however, it's time to let go, retire and do other things. This doesn't mean I am leaving Elkdom. I'll be enjoying our Lodge and participating in other ways as a Past District Deputy and mentor to Officers and Lodges.

I wanted to make a difference in each position I held, and I think I've accomplished much of what I've set out to do. I brought my business experience to the Trustees and the district Lodges. I brought my law enforcement experiences to the Drug Awareness Program. There were things I wanted to do as Lodge Secretary but failed to complete. I wanted to bring us into a better accounting position with a point of sale (POS) system. I got a lot of kickbacks from several members who would be using the



system, so I chose not to push it. In retrospect, I believe that was a mistake. We are one of only a few Lodges in California that don't have a POS. A point of sale system will reduce mistakes and make accounting much easier. A POS also allows reservations and pre-pay for events and services. As an example, dues payments and dinner reservations could be made on-line. Another thing I wanted to do was increase our beer sales and profit by adding more taps. I will still work on that project when I have more time.

We have recovered from the COVID era to a point close to where we were before the pandemic. The RV Park was the only part of our Lodge that was doing well during COVID. Currently, more and more members are using the Lodge as it is intended to be used. Our membership was at the highest between 1400 and 1500 members pre COVID. We are almost back to that level. Our lapsation this year will be about 5 ½%, which is very good. Financially, our Lodge is finally doing okay despite significant increases in the cost of goods. The increase in the cost of goods has primarily affected the kitchen. I am suggesting the House Committee charge \$2 more for Friday night dinners. That's an

8% increase per Friday night dinner for our members, but it will certainly make our bottom line much healthier. The reality is that you can't buy a steak dinner downtown for that. We use very good quality meat, serve a starch, vegetables, bread, and dessert. Regardless, our Lodge will end the year in the black.

We have some very good officers coming up next April. Ernie Nunes will be stepping back in as Lodge Secretary. Ernie has served as Lodge Treasurer for the past three years and seven years as Lodge Secretary before that. Bill Lambo will be taking over as the Treasurer. Bill is the secretary of Humboldt Masonic Lodge 79, so he brings a lot of experience to that position. The Board of Trustees is a five-year commitment. Each year one of the five trustee positions comes up for election. Next year Scotty Thomason will be the new Trustee. He brings a lot of experience to the position, having served as a college administrator for many years. Leading Knight, Shawn Doebel, will be taking the reins from Marta Martinez. Nina Strang is moving up to Loyal Knight. Ann Shuler is moving up to Chaplain. Larry Vance is coming back into the Officer Corps as the Lecturing Knight. Four newbies to the Officer Corps are Barry Smith as Leading Knight, Brett Engle as Esquire, Dan Rickman as Tiler, Shawna Bobillot as Inner Guard, William Lambo as Treasurer, and Scotty Thomason as Trustee.

We desperately need more help in all aspects of running our Lodge. We need volunteers in the kitchen as helpers or cooks, yard workers, servers, monthly inventory takers, facility maintenance, door greeters, general cleanup, bar tending, and other jobs within our Lodge.
