

For the 19th year, the North Coast Veterans Stand Down will be holding its three-day event at the Humboldt County Fairgrounds in Ferndale, September 26th, 27th & 28th.

Members of our lodge provide assistance to the Stand Down in multiple ways including setup and tear down of the event, providing the Thursday evening meal for participants along with supervising the distribution of clothing and personal care items to attendees. Lodge members Ann Poole and Bev Olson oversee the Stand Down Clothing and Small Goods Store. The ladies work year-round collecting donated items for the Stand Down. Donations include new and used clothing, winter coats, rain gear, sleeping bags, tents and shoes including vouchers for the purchase of a new pair from a local business.

For members who wish to donate items for the Stand Down there is a collection barrel in the closet just off the lobby at the lodge for your convenience to drop off any offerings. Items they are short of include: wallets, belts and suspenders and wool blend hiking socks. The veterans prefer the wool socks as they keep their feet warmer and dryer during our cold, wet winters.

All are more than welcome to come and volunteer for the whole event, one day or just a few hours. Ann and Bev in clothing appreciate any help that comes their way, as they are constantly rearranging clothing along with assisting any veterans that need help. 

From the millions of youngsters who participate and advance through local, district, state and regional competition, six national champions are named. One boy and one girl in each of three categories: ages 8-9, 10-11 and 12-13. The parents of finalists at the state, regional and national levels attend the competitions as guests of the Elks.

During the past Covid-19 epidemic several of the lodge's programs and activities were suspended or discontinued due to community restrictions. The Lodge's annual participation in the **Elks "Hoop Shoot" Free Throw Contest** was one of the programs. This year the lodge has established the goal to reinstate the program and provide the youth of Humboldt County the opportunity to participate. 
