Notice to all members,

The Board of Trustees recently developed a plan to re-roof the building over time. This is a preventative maintenance plan. The Trustees put the project out to bid. To re-roof the entire building would cost approximately \$270,000. The oldest part of the roof is over the kitchen and storage area; therefore, it was decided that this area should be the first portion of the roof to be re-roofed. The cost for this phase was \$78,000. The Trustees had that amount of money available in unrestricted accounts, such as, the building fund and maintenance accounts.

The project was discussed on the Lodge Floor and eventually voted on. The vote overwhelmingly passed to go ahead with the project. A permit application was requested and received from Grand Lodge in compliance with GL Statute

16.050. The application was completed; however, it for some reason never made it to Grand Lodge. A new permit application was completed and forwarded to Grand Lodge. Unfortunately, the portion of the roof that was scheduled for completion at this time was already finished. Therefore, the application was in hindsight.

Additionally, the Trustees had not realized that this project needed to be described in writing to the Lodge membership prior to Floor discussion and voting as described in GL Statute 16.050. This error in judgement was due to the fact that the money needed for this part of the project was available without restriction, and no loan was necessary. The Grand Lodge Trustee assigned to our application understands the Trustee error and has determined that we need to now send this notice to the membership in compliance with the Statutes.

This project will be brought to the Lodge Floor once again on February 19th for discussion. This phase of the project will be considered procedurally completed by acceptance of the previous motion, discussion and vote to go ahead with the project. Any dissention to this project should be brought to the Floor at that time. A motion in dissention, if made, will be discussed and voted on. Please note that the requested Grand Lodge Permit will cover the entire project; however, each future phase will be noticed in the Lodge Bulletin and brought to the Lodge Floor for a motion, discussion and vote.

A new set of bricks for the Veterans Recognition Wall have arrive and the committee is presently making arrangements to have them mounted in the near future. The Lodge's **Veteran's Memorial** was established by the Past Exalted Ruler's (PER's) to honor all veterans who have served our Nation. **For a donation of \$100 or more you name will be placed on a redwood burl plaque that is on display in the Lodge. For \$30 each you can have a Veteran's Name, Rank and Branch of Service engraved on a brick that will be placed on the Memorial Wall.** If you, a family member or a close friend served in the Military or Merchant Marines and you would like to honor them, please pick up an Order Form at the Lodge or contact the Lodge Clerk at elksclerk652@gmail.com or call (707) 442-6652.

The Eureka Elks Lodge will be celebrating their 125th Anniversary

The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks was started by a group of entertainers in New York City in February 1868. The Order was initially formed in late 1867 because New York had “blue laws,” which meant no public establishment was open on Sundays. A small group of entertainers formed a “private club” so they could meet and enjoy a drink together on Sundays.

They called themselves the “Jolly Corks”. Shortly before Christmas 1867, one of the members died, leaving a widow and children in destitution. The Jolly Corks decided to help them and become a more enduring organization. Deciding they needed a better name to fit with their ideals and goals, several names were suggested before it came down to two, Buffalo or Elks. The latter won by one vote and the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks became the name we all recognize today. It is commonly referred to as the BPOE.

Eureka Elks #652 is a very old and culturally rich Lodge. It was chartered in February 1901 having been sponsored by the San Francisco Elks Lodge. It was the largest charter in the history of Elkdom at the time.

The charter members first met in the Pythian Castle in Eureka, which is now occupied by Lost Coast Brewery. For the next few years, they met in the Odd Fellows Hall. The cornerstone for the first Elks Lodge was laid in 1909 and the building was finished in May 1910. Today it is the Umpqua Bank Building on the corner of 5th & H streets in Eureka

The Lodge was richly furnished with items purchased or donated from around the world. As an example, the solid marble, almost life-size statue of “Charity” came from Italy by ship in 1909. The Grandfather Clock was given by the Traveling Elks to the Lodge in 1923. The velvet padded dark mahogany wood benches and chairs are from 1910. Membership in the Eureka Elks Lodge continued to grow through the 1900s and it sponsored the Crescent City Lodge in 1946. The growth of Elkdom and the lack of parking led the members to purchase a lot off Herrick Avenue in the late 1950s. The Lodge we enjoy now was built on the Herrick Avenue lot in 1974.

The Lodge has been expanded three times to accommodate the increases in membership. The Eureka Elks now total more than 1,300 and the number continues to grow at about 100 members a year.

For the first time in recent history, the Eureka Elks Lodge will be open to the general public when the Lodge holds it’s 125th Anniversary in the spring of 2026.

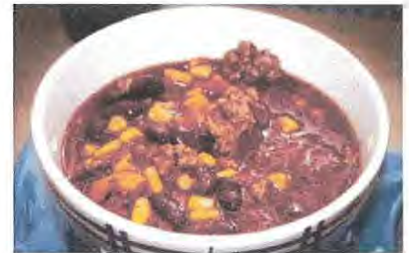
