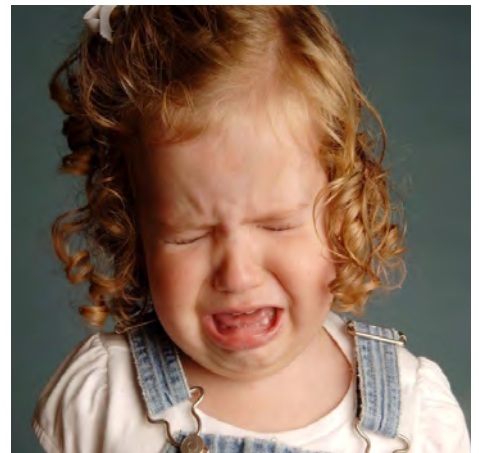

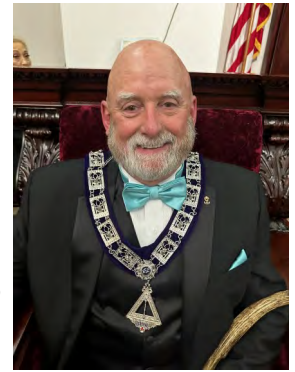

Eureka Elks Lodge #652 honored Bene't Frame as the Premier Recipient on the 75th Anniversary of the Purple Pig Project.

In 1950, the Eureka Elks Lodge began helping developmentally disabled children in a program, the Major Project Mobile Unit. Bene't Frame was their very first patient from 5 to 21 years old. She was born with cerebral palsy and seizures. Bene't received OT, PT and speech therapy thru the project. She has had many fond memories and has given back to the children in the program by organizing the Christmas celebration which they received stockings full of goodies from the Elks. Bene't has attended five Elks Conventions. The first in 1950 where she received a red bike and then becoming a keynote speaker as a young adult. She said, "The Elks were so nice. They cared about people like me". Veteran's Corner

"So long as there are veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them."

During dinner on March 5, 2025, the Veterans Committee presented a check for \$1000 to the Cal Poly Humboldt Veterans Center. Their program, Veterans Enrollment and Transition Services (VETS) is dedicated to supporting Veterans, active duty, military reserve component personnel, and their families. The program, during the fall semester, served 600 students. Services include advising, community-building and coordination of military and veteran-specific resources such as GI Bill support, CalVet Fee waivers, and more. In addition, the Center provides Workshops, Work-study and referrals programs, study areas and just a place to hang out.

With this \$1000 donation, this brings the total donations, from the Veterans Committee to providers of local veteran's services for the 2024-2025 Columbian Year, to \$5720. An additional \$1000 Freedom Grant funded this year's lodge donation to the North Coast Veterans Stand Down for a total of \$6720 distributed funds.

Veterans Committee meetings are held at the lodge on the 2nd Monday of the month, 5:30 PM. Our next meeting is April 14, 2025. We encourage you to join us. One does not have to be a veteran to serve on the committee.

National Prescription Drug Take Back Day April 26, 2025

April 26, 2025 the Drug Enforcement Agency holds its **National Prescription Drug Take Back Day**. Take Back Day, held twice yearly in April and October, is your chance to rid your medicine cabinet of unneeded Tablets, Capsules, Patches and Other solid forms of prescription drugs. Although there was not a designated drop off area for Humboldt County on April 26th you can still deposit expired, unused or unwanted medications utilizing **Local Medication Disposal Bins** which are available year-round.



Before depositing you need to:

- Remove medications from containers
- Place them in sealed or zipped plastic bags
- Drop them into the bin
- Do not drop off sharps (needles, syringes, Epi Pens).

These pharmacies have bins that can take unused or expired medications.

Arcata: Arcata Police Department and Barnes Family Drug

Eureka: Eureka Police Department, Lima's Professional Pharmacy and the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office

Fortuna: Green's Pharmacy **Ferndale:** Ring's Pharmacy **Scotia:** Palco Pharmacy

Willow Creek: Willow Creek Pharmacy **Garberville:** Humboldt County Sheriff's Office

Many of the larger chain pharmacy departments, CVS, Walgreens, Safeway have Disposal Bins or will take back unused prescription drugs across the counter. Costco has mailing packets available at no cost.

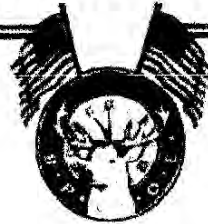
