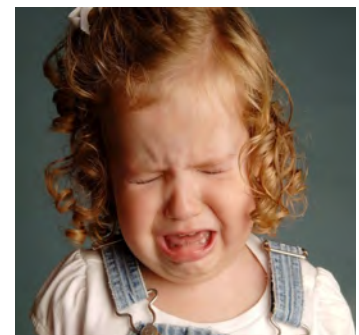

Lodge Secretary's Corner

Great news; there are 32 people in the line to become members. I am processing them as fast as I can. Our Lodge has 1,326 members as of May 21st. There are 251 members who have not paid their dues for 2025-2026. They had until the end of May to pay without penalty. Unfortunately, those who have not paid by now will need to reinstate. That means our lapsation rate is 19%, which is a little high for this time of the year. We usually end the year with a 5% lapsation rate, which is great. Our membership could reach 1,600 this year. Here are a couple of things to think about. First, the bands we have on Friday nights are costing us on average \$700 per week. When we have 250 members and guests for dinner and full bar after dinner the cost of the band is covered by profits. Unfortunately, the number of members and guests for dinner and drinks is currently not covering the cost of the band. Traditionally, the Lodge has charged a \$5.00 cover for those who came in and enjoyed the band without eating. I would like to see that tradition return in force.



My usual office hours are 9:00 am to 1:00 pm Monday through Friday. I usually come to work shortly after 8:00 and often return to work about 4:00 in the afternoon for night meetings or to catch up with business.

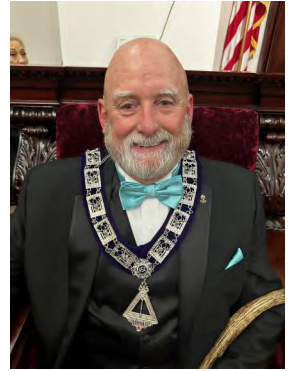

Greetings to my fellow members of Elks Lodge #652,

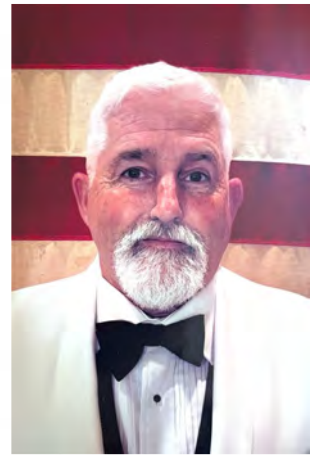

Henry Geiger was born in Saint Louis, Missouri. Oldest of 6 children. Henry is blessed with 4 adult children and 7 grandchildren. Henry and Tiffany have been married since 2009, and he credits his success to Tiffany's constant encouragement.

Under his leadership, the lodge initiated numerous new members and reinstatements, earning him the Officer of the Year award for both terms.

Biography for California-Hawaii Elks Association President Scott Stephens

Scott Stephens was born in Detroit, Michigan. After finishing school, at 22 years old, he picked up and moved to California. This turned out to be one of his best decisions, because he met the love of his life, Mary Kay a few years later. They were married in 1987 and have 2 adult children. They spend their time enjoying family, friends, cruising and Elksdom.

Scott has been a member of The Fullerton Elks Lodge #1993 of the Orange Coast District (the OCD as he affectionately refers to it) for 30 years, where he and Mary Kay, have been very involved. He became a Greeter almost immediately and volunteered on the Sunday Brunch committee for 10 years (the last 9 as Chairman). He Chaired their Christmas Tree Lane program for 12 years, hosting 500-600 people & raising approximately \$15,000 annually. He helped at VA Hospital visitations, picnics, and many other lodge programs and was named Elk of the Year in 1999.

Scott became Lodge Chaplain 6 years after joining, then served as Esquire and every Chair Officer position. He was awarded Officer of the Year along the way and became Exalted Ruler in 2003-2004 where he adopted his motto, "Sold on Elksdom". To this day Scott has a great appreciation and respect for the Initiation Ritual, receiving 6 First Place Ritual Trophies (1 All State). He attained his Floor Judge's certification as a Jr. PFR, served as a judge for several years and was the Lodge Ritual Coach for 8 years (still helping today). For the past 5 years (and to this day) he's been the editor of the lodge's monthly newsletter, manages the Lodge and District Facebook pages and is the Caller, Emcee & Auctioneer for many Lodge & District fundraiser events.

He served on the District Veterans Committee for 2 years, was the District Americanism Chairman, was Photographer for 2 District Deputies and CHEA Pres., Art Echternacht. Scott served as Esquire to the District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler in 2015-16. During that time, he was also one of the top ENF fundraising District Chairs in the country for 3 years, and #1 in CHEA for 2 of the 3. The Orange Coast District raised \$364,667 during those 3 years. He and his wife have also raised over \$37,000 for CHEMPI and ENF by hosting 9 cruises over the last 16 years.

At the state level, Scott served as CHEA Vice President for the Orange Coast District (attending all 14 visits, with President Chuck Nolan). He has served as CHEA ENF Vice Chair, in charge of Grants. During which time California-Hawaii Elks Lodges increased their Grant usage by 42 grants, which brought \$278,500 more into our communities. He served 3 years on the CHEA Board of Trustees, finally as its Chairman, and this past year as the CHEA 1st Vice President.

At the Grand Lodge level, Scott served as the Orange Coast District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler and by Grand Lodge Executive Order, he served as a Special Representative for a neighboring Lodge (then was their Lodge Advisor for 5 years). He is currently serving as a Co-District Leader.

As mentioned earlier, Scott's motto is "Sold on Elksdom", because that's what the Benevolent & Protective Order of Elks, deserves from us. Someone once said, "Service is the rent we pay for the space we occupy." Will you serve the Elks a little more, by being **SOLD on ELKDOM?**

Pierre Carbonneau 2025 CHEA "Male Veteran" Volunteer of the Year.

During the May California-Hawaii Elks Association Convention it was announced that [Pierre Carbonneau](#), member of our lodge had been selected as the [2025 CHEA Male Veteran Volunteer of the Year](#). Exalter Ruler Nina Strang accepted the award on his behalf at the convention. The lodge presented the award to Pierre during the special Veterans Committee dinner on May 18th.

Pierre has served the lodge on various committees including, Trustee and Lodge Safety Officer. On the Veterans Committee he serves as the Committee Vice Chairman, Chairman of the Annual Elks/Veterans Car Show and Co-Chairman of the Eureka Veterans Medical Clinic Pantry Project. He is the committee's liaison to local organizations providing support services for veterans. These include the Cal Poly Humboldt Veterans Center, American Veterans (AMVETS) Post 96, Mad River Veterans Honor Guard, VFW and American Legion Posts and the United Bikers of America. He is an active participant in providing support for the North Coast Veterans Stand Down, Veteran Recognition Wall Project, R.E.D Friday Dinner, Eureka's Nations Finest Transitional Housing Facility, the Lost Coast Chief Petty Officers Emergency Relief Fund (Coast Guard) and Elks Veteran Service Welcome Home Kit project. He is a founding member and co-host of the Humboldt Hero's Project which honors a local veteran each month and is an active member of the VA's Million Veteran's Personnel Research Project. His leadership on the lodge's Veterans Committee has witnessed the committee growing from three members to twenty members.

With his connections with local veteran service providers the lodge has been able to identify specific programs most in need of assistance. The Eureka CA Elks Lodge #652 is now recognized within the community as a major participant and an equal partner along with other local Veterans Service Provider organizations which include county, state, national, tribal and non-profit agencies.

As the recipient of the CHEA award Pierre has been nominated for the National Elk Male Volunteer of the Year Award which will be announced at the end of June.

Veterans Committee meetings are held at the lodge on the 2nd Monday of the month, 5:30 PM. Our next meeting is June 9, 2025. We encourage you to join us. One does not have to be a veteran to serve on the committee

The program's Drug Awareness Program Resource Center provides parents, teachers and kids access to educational materials including anti-drug literature, videos, coloring books, posters, public service announcements and prevention tools for parents along with information on the annual poster, essay and video contests.

Mother of the Year

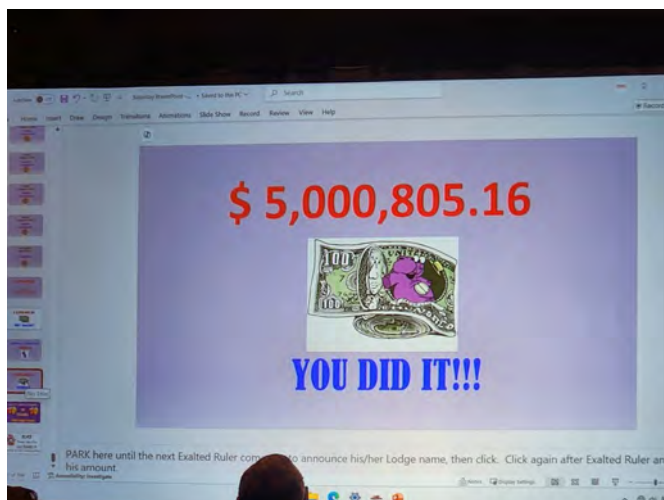

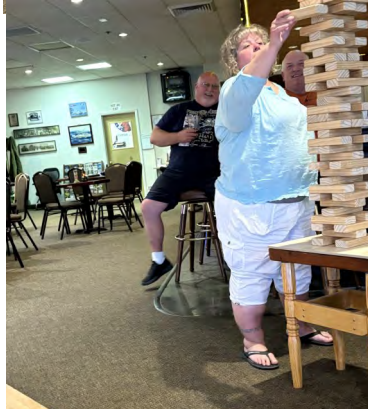
