Secretary's Corner

I thought I would clear up some misunderstandings and grumblings. The Club Operations of the Eureka Lodge are managed by a House Committee consisting of seven (varies) members. They set policy based on information from the Lodge administration and members in general. Brian Smith, Loyal Knight and chairman of the House Committee wrote a very good article in last month's Herd Talk that talked about a monthly loss in food service and what to do about it. He mentioned an average of \$4,000 loss per month. I thought I would add to that by explaining in some detail each of the areas he mentioned.

The problem is the Cost Of Goods or COG. The COG for the food service has been running greater than 50%, which is unattainable. Grand Lodge recommends a COG of 35% for food and liquor service. The reason for this seemingly small percentage is that other costs need to be considered. These other costs include such things as utilities, labor, garbage service, taxes of all sorts, etc. The Lodge Administration breaks down these other costs and allocates them to each entity. A portion to the Liquor Service, the Food Service, the Lodge and the RV Park. There are several reasons why our COG is so high. The House Committee is trying to address each.

One issue is the gratis meals given to volunteers. This is a touchy subject. Those of us who volunteer are by definition not receiving any pay for our service. The problem is we have been giving free meals for a decades. This creates entitlements. The cooks, often four of them, are certainly working for more than a few hours and deserve of a free meal. Bartenders, often two or three of them, also work more than a few hours and certainly entitled to a free meal. The salad bar makers, often two or three of them, work for two or more hours. The door greeters, often two of them, work for at least two hours. The two cashiers work for about two hours. The one or two dishwashers work for at least four hours washing and cleaning up. Add that up and it takes between 12 and 16 volunteers to put on a meal.

The math explains the problem better than anything else. Wednesday and Friday night meals are for our membership and their guests. We usually serve less than 100 on Wednesdays and usually less than 150 on Fridays. This translates into us giving away about 14% of the meals served. Reducing the 50% COG by 14% and it makes a significant difference. The COG drops to about 43%, which is much better.

One issue is the high cost of food. Everyone understands the higher costs for food of any kind. Beef is especially high for whatever reason. Friday night steaks are either new-yorks or rib-eyes, depending on the price we have to pay. Buying at the right price is what the House Committee is trying to do. They have appointed a buyer, who helps plan meals. She reviews pricing from different sources and makes suggestions then orders based on what is best at that time. Planning and buying with the costs in mind will undoubtedly help. Better planning should save about 5% on the COG. Tied in with the buying is what is commonly called "loss prevention".

Membership participation is another issue. Food that has been over purchased and is outdated must be thrown away. When 100 members have signed up for a dinner the meal is prepared to accommodate 100. Many times for different reasons, less than those signed up actually come for the meal. This means that those that don't come have wasted the food for that particular meal. We are not a seven day a week kitchen; therefore, food can't be carried over and sold during a different day. Being able to cook the right amount of food for the members should save us a little bit more towards reaching a proper COG.

Pricing our meals at what is fair is another issue. Wednesday night dinners at \$18 is marginal, but okay as far as the COG. Friday nights are a much bigger problem. Cook your own steak at \$28 is a deal for our members that is pushing the COG to an unattainable amount. Think about what you are getting. A meal of new-york or rib-eye steak, a full salad bar, a steam table with a starch, bread, vegetable, and dessert. The bonus is a live dance band and a reasonably priced bar. The Lodge pays about \$700 for a band on Friday nights. Not only that, the 8.75% sales tax is included in the price of both the meal and the drinks. You can't get that anywhere else.

How do we fix the problem. The House Committee does, by statute, have the authority to manage the "Club" as long as they are within budgetary constraints. I have some suggestions. First is to continue buying right and controlling inventory. They are doing a good job at that. Second is to pass along sales tax. Sales tax on a Friday night dinner is \$2.25. Charging the sales tax would reduce the annual deficit by about \$36,000. Third is to pass some costs to the volunteers based on hours worked. Fourth is to change the meals from time to time to a less expensive protein, such as Baby Back Pork Ribs or Chicken.

The Volunteer issue is the critical one because it involves changing the tradition of giving everyone who volunteers a gratis meal. Perhaps reducing the number of volunteers needed per meal would help. I don't know, but I think the volunteers should all be consulted and asked their opinions on how to best reduce the deficit. Certainly, the price of a Friday night dinner needs to be raised to at least 30.00 to cover the tax. Thank goodness it's the House Committee's responsibility and not mine.

AMMENDMENTS and ADDITIONS TO LODGE BYLAWS

Amendments to the Bylaws of Eureka 652 must be published and read on the Lodge Floor before a vote is taken. The amendments then need Judiciary review before becoming effective. It is intended for the following Bylaw amendments and additions to become effective April 1st, 2026. Discussions on each will be on the Lodge Floor at the first and second meeting in January. A vote on each will occur during the second meeting in January.

The two proposed amendments that deal with the Secretary and Treasurer positions are to bring them into better compliance with minimum wage laws. These proposed Bylaw amendments ensure that the wage paid to both the Secretary and the Treasurer will be raised whenever to whatever the legal minimum wage is as it changes.

OF THE SECRETARY: Currently the Bylaw reads: **For the faithful performance of his duties, he shall receive as compensation \$17,160.00 per annum, payable every two weeks.** This is based on a half-time position, or four hours per weekday plus night meetings at \$15.00 per hour. The proposed Bylaw change for the Secretary is **for the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation a sum based on minimum wage for 1088 hours per annum, paid monthly.** This would increase the Secretary's wage by \$792 per annum at this time.

OF THE TREASURER: Currently the Bylaws reads: **“He shall be required to give bond to the Lodge in the sum of \$10,000 for the faithful performance of his duties and shall receive compensation for his services the sum of \$9,360 per annum, payable every two weeks.”** This is based on a quarter-time position, or two hours per weekday plus night meetings at \$15.00 per hour. The proposed changes for the Treasurer are **He shall be required to give bond to the Lodge in the sum of \$10,000. For the faithful performance of his duties, he shall receive as compensation a sum based on minimum wage of 618 hours per annum, paid monthly.** This would increase then Treasurer's wage by \$837 per annum at this time.

The House Committee is requesting the addition of two (2) new House Rules. The rules were created to reduce potential liability. The House Rules are a part of the Lodge Bylaws. Rule number 19 and 20 would read as follows:

19. Minors under the age of eighteen (18) attending any event within the Lodge must be accompanied and supervised by a responsible adult.

20. Children under the age of twelve (12) are prohibited from using the pool tables and card tables.

The Bylaws Committee is recommending the following change to the House Rules. Currently rule 10 reads: **The wearing of head coverings is prohibited in the Lodge, except those for required medical reasons or those that are costumes for a special event.**

The proposed change would read: **The wearing of head covering is prohibited in the Lodge Room at any time and in the dining room when meals are served, except those required for medical reasons or those that are costumes for a special event.**

The Board of Trustees are requesting a dues increase of \$10 to offset the increase in costs. The proposed dues increase would not affect those who are renewing their dues for 2026-2027. However, their dues would increase for 2027-2028. The current dues are as follows: **The regular dues shall be \$140 per year, which shall not include the Grand Lodge per capita fee, the Grand Lodge per capita insurance assessment, and the State Association dues.**

The increase in dues would read as follows: **The regular dues shall be \$150 per year, which should not include the Grand Lodge per capita fee, the Grand Lodge per capita insurance assessment, and the State Association dues.**

The Lodge Administration is recommending an increase in the application fee, which will hopefully curtail the number of applicants who apply, but do not follow through and become members. The current application fee is as follows: **The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant who has passed his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$50.00, all of which should accompany the proposition. The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant making application prior to his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$50.00, all of which should accompany the proposition.**

The increase in the application fee would read as follows: **The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant who has passed his twenty-sixth birthday should be \$100.00, all of which should accompany the proposition. The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant making application prior to his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$100.00, all of which should accompany the proposition.**

Veteran's Committee

Due to the number of Veteran Committee activities for the months of September through November of 2025 we were not able to include the following Herd Talk updates:

United Bikers of Northern California Veterans Day Lunch: On November 9th the committee with the assistance of members of the Eureka Knights of Pythias #34 provided lunch for them as they finished their annual Memorial Day Ceremonial Run to honor the veterans buried in our local cemeteries.

Veterans Day at McKay 5k & 10K Run/Walk. The committee donated \$500 to the event held on November 15th. All proceeds benefit local Veterans outdoor recreation and creative arts.

December activities included:

Veterans Transitional Training Alliance WWII Memorial Kiosk Restoration Project. The committee donated \$1000 to the project. The kiosk is located in the lobby of the Arcata/Eureka Airport terminal.

Elks National Veterans Service Commission (ENVS) Welcome Home Kit: The committee provided two additional Welcome Home Kits to veterans moving into a new home after a period of homelessness. Each Kit is reimbursed by the ENVS up to \$400 or \$600 (if a bed is included). The two additional kits bringing the total of **11 kits** distributed this year with a value of **\$3406.80**.


