DUES FOR 2026—2027

Those members who have not paid their dues for 2026 – 2027 need to do so now. The Lodge door is being tiled during member events. 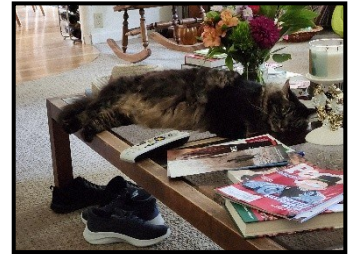

Introduction of Application by Eureka Elks Lodge #652

The facility parcel number is 301-131-003-000, consisting of 5.99 acres with one main structure and several outbuildings. The main facility is approximately 22,000 square feet. The property was assessed by Humboldt County in 2025 for \$2,666,982. The commercial appraisal as ordered by the banking institution for the last expansion was done in 2012. The building was expanded by 5,100 square feet. The appraised value after the expansion was \$3,810,000.

The mortgage was a 15-year loan of \$1,200,000 at 4%, amortized for 30 years. The current mortgage balance with Coast Central Credit Union is \$590,356. There are no other liens against the property. The loan was due in June. As a consequence, the monthly payment rose to \$5,900. The current lender offered to refinance for 6.25 percent amortization of 30 years, which would have reduced the monthly payment, but added to the cost of borrowing the money.

The Board of Trustees put the refinance out to bid to three institutions. Redwood Capital Bank, a local institution, was selected by the Trustees and recommended to the Lodge membership. Redwood Capital offered a refinance and an inclusion of the cost of re-roofing at 6%, amortization for 25 years. The Lodge membership after

discussion concurred by a unanimous vote as noted in the minutes.

The Lodge applied for a building permit in 2024 to re-roof the building for \$270,000. The Building Application was filed after the fact. The Lodge had already re-roofed a portion of the building at a cost of \$76,000+ with Lodge money.

The \$270,000 had been approved by the Lodge three different times while attempting to comply with the statutes. The process became convoluted and confusing; therefore, the application was withdrawn. A copy of a letter dated August 29, 2025, cancelling the permit was attached.

The opportunity to refinance and re-roof with the same institution at the same time is too good to pass on. The Lodge is adding \$250,000 to the mortgage, which is the reason for the Building Application. The project has been under discussion since June of 2024. The Lodge Floor has voted approval of the project and financing at every juncture. The refinance will reduce the monthly mortgage by \$500. and still pay for the re-roof.

With the new year, even though we are three months in with our new officers, I wanted to take this opportunity to introduce myself and tell you a little bit about my plans for the rest of the fraternal year.

Currently, we are doing an “opportunity drawing” for a Blackstone 22” table top griddle with a stand, a set of Blackstone taco tray, a stainless steel griddle tool set, a grill mat to keep your tools clean, and 2 pounds of both breakfast sausage and hamburger from Ferndale Meat Co. This is a GREAT deal.

Tickets are \$5 each. If you buy 4 tickets for \$20, you will get a free ticket. If you buy 8 tickets for \$40,

you will get 2 free tickets. As an added bonus, for buying the whole sheet of tickets (10 on a sheet), you will receive an extra free ticket. That is 11 tickets for \$40. We will be at the lodge before the Wednesday and Friday dinners to sell tickets. We will be drawing the winning ticket on the evening of July 31. **You do not need to be present to win so make sure we get your phone number.**

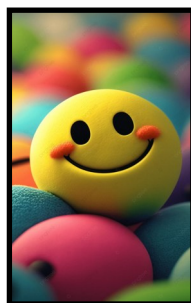

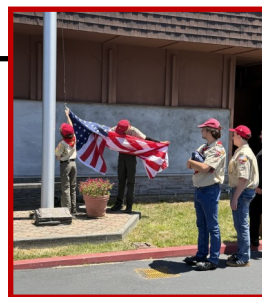

Elks National Drug Awareness Program

The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks National Drug Awareness Program is the largest volunteer drug awareness program in the United States. Since 1982, the Elks have developed an effective, community-based drug prevention program by partnering with federal agencies including the Drug Enforcement Agency, Office of National Drug Control Policy, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, and national organizations such as Pride Youth Programs. These partnerships ensure the Elks Drug Awareness Program addresses the leading drug abuse issues facing communities today.

The program's Resource Center provides parents, teachers and kids access to educational materials including anti-drug literature, videos, coloring books, posters, public service announcements and prevention tools for parents along with information on the annual poster, essay and video contests.

Every year, the Elks Drug Awareness Program distributes more than seven million pieces of anti-drug literature to parents, teachers and kids. The Elks have also teamed with Marvel Comic Books to produce a book featuring Marvel superheroes and Elroy the Elk in a battle against underage drinking. Other

educational materials offered by the program include prevention tools for parents, videos, coloring books, posters, classroom activities with teachers guides and public service announcements. The Elks Kid Zone (grades 3-6) and Elks Teen Zone (grades 6-12) sites provide age specific materials and activities which include Interactive Activities and Classroom lessons with Teachers Guides.
